



4 Promises for Safety

You are the center of my life, and I will do all that I can to protect you through every step of your childhood.

First

If you're less than 1 year old and weigh less than 20 lbs., you'll always travel in a rear-facing safety seat placed in the backseat.



Second

It is best for you to ride rear-facing until you reach the highest weight or height allowed by the car safety seat. If you are at least 1 year old and weigh between 20 and 40 lbs., you'll always travel in the backseat in a forward-facing safety seat.

Third

If you weigh more than 40 lbs. but are under 4 feet, 9 inches tall, you'll travel in a belt-positioning booster seat placed in the backseat. That way the seat belt will fit you correctly.



Fourth

When you are at least 4 feet, 9 inches tall and under the age of 13, you will always travel in the backseat. I will always make sure to buckle you in correctly.
